
- Intergovernmental Organisation (1893)




82 States + 1 Regional Economic Integration Organisation (EU)



152 States/Parties "Connected" to the HCCH




- Member of the HCCH (82 States + EU)

Membership Growth






36 new Members since 2000



Brazil and the HCCH

- HCCH Member since 23 February 2001
- Contracting Party to 7 Conv's and 1 Protocol:
 - 1961 Apostille Convention (entered into force for Brazil in 2016)
 - 1965 Service Convention (entered into force for Brazil in 2019)
 - 1970 Evidence Convention (entered into force for Brazil in 2014)
 - 1980 Child Abduction Convention (entered into force for Brazil in 2000)
 - 1980 Access to Justice Convention (entered into force for Brazil in 2012)
 - 1993 Intercountry Adoption Convention (entered into force for Brazil in 1999)
 - 2007 Child Support Convention (entered into force for Brazil in 2017)
 - 2007 Protocol on Law Applicable to Maintenance Obligations (entered into force for Brazil in 2017)


